

Sugar Act

Act that put a three-cent tax on foreign refined sugar and increased taxes on coffee, indigo, and certain kinds of wine.

Sugar Act

It banned importation of rum and French wines.

Tea Act

This act lowered the price on a certain East Indies Company item so much that it was way below prices from other suppliers.

Tea Act

American colonists saw this law as yet another means of "taxation without representation" because it meant that they couldn't buy this product from anyone else (including other colonial merchants) without spending a lot more money

Stamp Act

First direct British tax on
American colonists

Stamp Act

Every newspaper, pamphlet,
and other public and legal
document had to have a mark,
or British seal, on it.

Quartering Act

Lead to the writing of the Third Amendment on the bounds of military housing

Quartering Act

Provided "them" with food and alcohol, and providing for fire, candles, vinegar, salt, bedding, and utensils for this group "without paying any thing for the same".

Quebec Act

Measure designed to afford greater rights to the French inhabitants of Canada, which had come under British rule through the Treaty of Paris in 1763

Quebec Act

This act caused Colonies with western land claims to be firmly cut off from what they hoped would be future development and wealth.

Massachusetts Act

Majesty's governor would appoint "all judges of the inferior courts of common p, the attorney general, provosts, marshals, justices of the peace, and other officers to the council or courts of justice.

Massachusetts Act

The act did away with elections.
